Programs & Services

HOME VISITS

Home visits are available through Children's Integrated Services for families who have:

- A child with medical conditions or developmental delays.
- A need for family or parenting support, mental health, or preventative nursing services.

PARENT EDUCATION & SUPPORT

Parenting classes using evidenced-based and evidence informed curriculums, support groups, resources and information available both online and in-person.

EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION

PlayWorks Child Center provides quality childcare and preschool in a nurturing environment to children ages 6 weeks to 6 years.

WELCOME BABY & DIAPER BANK

Any parent or guardian with a baby living in our service region can access free diapers and wipes from our diaper bank, as well as receive a free Welcome Baby Bag filled with gifts and resources.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Working with schools, parents, community members and other agencies, SAPCC helps develop programming and events that meet the needs of families with young children in our community. We also provide several meeting spaces free of charge to community groups – call to reserve a space.

PLAYGROUPS

Free playgroups offer parents and children opportunities to socialize, learn and have fun in a safe environment.

CHILD CARE SUPPORT SERVICES

Referral and financial assistance for childcare, summer camp and before/after school care.

FAMILY SUPPORTIVE HOUSING

The FSH program engages homeless and at-risk families in case management to address obstacles regarding housing needs, acquire housing, and provide up to 24 months of support and services.

DULCE

Developmental Understanding and Legal Collaboration for Everyone (DULCE) is a six-month program for parents of newborns receiving care at Mount Ascutney Pediatrics. DULCE provides information, support, and connects families to existing community resources available to them.

OUTREACH, INFO & REFERRAL

SAPCC provides a welcoming environment with professional staff who are ready to address the immediate needs and/or contribute to the long-term well-being of families. We serve as a first-contact for parents and caregivers; providing information as well as connecting families with local or statewide resources.
